Our Midcoast Y region primarily serves the towns of Arrowsic, Bath, Bowdoin, Bowdoinham, Brunswick, Dresden, Georgetown, Harpswell, Phippsburg, Richmond, Topsham, West Bath, Wiscasset, and Woolwich. Membership is also recognized for individuals and families from other towns and cities in Maine.

Our non-profit status was achieved in an IRS ruling dated November 4, 1942.

4) Deserving Youth Membership Opportunity

5) Up to 11 new Youth memberships would be provided.

6) \$2,500.00

7) The membership is valid for one year from the time of application acceptance.

8) The Bath Area Family YMCA/Y Landing is for Youth Development, Healthy Living, and Social Responsibility. Collaborations with schools, hospitals, and other nonprofits in a safe, nonresidential setting, for children as well as adults, sets us apart from other not for profit agencies.

9) Our 2014 sources of income, \$2,458,152, include the following categories:

10) The Bath Area Family YMCA is a community focused nonprofit organization established in 1856 with recreational and services for all ages. The Y Landing in Brunswick is a site location for the Bath Area Family YMCA that opened on January 12, 2016. There is a "fun for everyone" philosophy at each location. Available activities and services include Aquatics, Before and After School Care programs,

Youth Interest programs, as well as fully equipped fitness and strength centers at each location for individuals above the age of twelve with adult supervisor for twelve and thirteen year olds.

11) It is highly probable that membership availability to youth, as mentioned in number twelve below, after one year would be available. Across the nation, YMCA's do not turn down individuals due to their lack of financial resources. All considerations would be given to extend the membership with financial assistance, if necessary.

12) Funds requested from the MRRRA Charitable Foundation totaling \$2,500.00 would enable up to eleven youth memberships for one full year. An example of the use of funds could be to add to the activities for youth servicing organizations located at Brunswick Landing as well as other collaborative efforts with other organizations promoting child wellness or teen centers in the Brunswick area.

13) Using the funds to attract youth who otherwise may not have knowledge of the mission of the Y locations, Youth Development, Healthy Living, and Social Responsibility, could empower the youth to gain even more confidence in a focused, high energy environment.

14) The funds requested will assist us in promoting youth development in a safe and stress-free environment. Other grant writing opportunities will be explored to secure additional funding for youth using the Y facilities for organizations such as the Seeds of Independence and the People Plus Teen Center.
